## Competitions wet weather protocol

There are no minimum ends played that constitute a game as having a result. So, for example, having played 11 ends or more in a 21 end match and then stopping, does not mean the score becomes the result.

If the greens become unplayable then play will be suspended or postponed to a later date. The match referee will decide.

The referee will be either Bob Leeson or Paul Charlton.

If the greens are playable but a player feels it is unsafe, then they can agree with their opponents to suspend/postpone their game.

If agreement is not found between the players then the match referee will decide.

Decisions will be made in the spirit of the game so no player is endangered or prevented from continuing for unpleasant, but not unsafe, conditions.

This does not mean any other games being played have to stop although the match referee may decide to suspend/postpone all play.

Play should only be temporarily suspended or postponed at the completion of the end being played.

On resumption of the match (whether on the same or a different day) the score continues from where it left off (same green, same direction of play, same coloured marker as if there had been no delay.
