

# Competitions wet weather protocol

**There are no minimum ends played that constitute a game as having a result. So, for example, having played 11 ends or more in a 21 end match and then stopping, does not mean the score becomes the result.**

**If the greens become unplayable then play will be suspended or postponed to a later date. The match referee will decide.**

**The referee will be either Bob Leeson or Paul Charlton.**

**If the greens are playable but a player feels it is unsafe, then they can agree with their opponents to suspend/postpone their game.**

**If agreement is not found between the players then the match referee will decide.**

**Decisions will be made in the spirit of the game so no player is endangered or prevented from continuing for unpleasant, but not unsafe, conditions.**

**This does not mean any other games being played have to stop although the match referee may decide to suspend/postpone all play.**

**Play should only be temporarily suspended or postponed at the completion of the end being played.**

**On resumption of the match (whether on the same or a different day) the score continues from where it left off (same green, same direction of play, same coloured marker as if there had been no delay.**
